In 1984, Peter Freeman moved to Cape Cod and opened his private practice, specializing in all aspects of real estate development and affordable housing, as well as business and family law and civil litigation. In addition to CLI (of which he is a 1994 graduate), Peter currently serves as a director of the Cape Cod Justice for Youth Collaborative, Our First Home, Inc. and Housing Assistance Corp. and is on the Advisory Board of AmeriCorps of Cape Cod.
